Warren is an industrial suburb bordering Detroit and is set amid the “Big Three” auto industry. Cousino’s proximity to the GM Technical Center, the world’s largest auto research institute, and the satellite automotive and technical business nearby has focused the attention of the community on academic achievement, technological proficiency and career preparation.

Warren Consolidated Schools is the eleventh largest district in Michigan with approximately 15,450 students. Cousino is one of three high schools within the Warren Consolidated District.

The Cousino High School attendance area encompasses part of the Warren and Sterling Heights, Michigan in Macomb County. Our students, largely children of second and third generation European, Asian, and Middle Eastern immigrants, seek affordable housing, excellent schools and career opportunities in automotive and technological professions. The Cousino High School new population mimics the Macomb County trend of showing significant growth in New Americans and African Americans in the state.

Because of the diversity of its programs, Cousino has won a reputation for innovative instruction and well-prepared graduates in both academic and vocational education. Students may choose programs from district created and managed magnet schools as well as specialized programs at Cousino.

→ Our CAREER PREPARATION CENTER, the largest of these magnet schools, provides sixteen specialized and technical programs for juniors and seniors, ranging from culinary arts to computer information systems.

→ The MACOMB MATHEMATICS SCIENCE TECHNOLOGY CENTER (MMSTC), includes both the MMSTC High School and Middle School. MMSTC is a consortium of ten school districts, offers an interdisciplinary, accelerated program of studies involving students in collaborative projects that prepare students for careers in science and mathematics.

→ The WARREN CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL OF PERFORMING ARTS focuses on performance production through acting, dancing, set design and construction.

CURRICULUM AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of twenty-two and one half (22.5) credits is required for graduation. Classes are semesterized and students may earn a maximum of six credits per year in twelve classes.

Graduation requirements include:

- 4 Years of English = 4 credits
- 4 Years of Math = 4 credits
- 3 Year of Science = 3 credits
- .5 Semester of Health = ½ credit
- .5 Semester of Physical education = ½ credit
- 1 Semester of Visual Performing Arts = 1 credit
- 3 Years of Social studies = 3 credits
- 2 Years of a World Language*
- 4.5 Credits of electives.

*May partially or fully fulfill 1 credit of this requirement by completing a department-approved formal Career Technical Program or curriculum or by completing Visual Performing Arts Instruction.
